孟獻子曰:「畜馬乘,不察於雞豚;伐冰之家,不畜牛羊;百乘之家,不畜聚斂之臣。 與其有聚斂之臣,寧有盜臣。」此謂國不以利為利,以義為利也。長國家而務財用者, 必自小人矣。彼為善之,小人之使為國家,災害并至。雖有善者,亦無如之何矣!此謂 國不以利為利,以義為利也。

The officer Meng Xian said, "He who keeps horses and a carriage does not look after fowls and pigs. The family which keeps its stores of ice does not rear cattle or sheep. So, the house which possesses a hundred chariots should not keep a minister to look out for imposts that he may lay them on the people. Than to have such a minister, it were better for that house to have one who should rob it of its revenues." This is in accordance with the saying:-"In a state, financial gain is not to be considered to be prosperity, but its prosperity will be found in righteousness." When he who presides over a state or a family makes his revenues his chief business, he must be under the influence of some small, mean man. He may consider this man to be good; but when such a person is employed in the administration of a state or family, calamities from Heaven, and injuries from men, will befall it together, and, though a good man may take his place, he will not be able to remedy the evil. This illustrates again the saying, "In a state, gain is not to be considered prosperity, but its prosperity will be found in righteousness."

#### Translation of Original Text in the Book of the Great Learning

孟獻子曰: 「畜馬乘, 察於雞豚; 伐冰之家, 畜牛羊;

The officer Meng Xian said, "He who keeps carriage with horses does not look after gains from raising fowls and pigs; the family who uses blocks of ice to pay respect does not pursue gains from raising cattle or sheep;

與其有聚斂之臣, 臣。

百乘之家,不畜聚斂之臣。the family who possesses a hundred chariots should not keep advisors to look out for ways to impose unfair taxes on the people. Instead of having such advisors, it would be better to have an advisor to rob itself of its wealth."

以義 此謂國不以利為利, 為利也。

This is in accordance with the saying: "In a state, financial gain is not to be considered as prosperity, but prosperity is found in righteousness."

長國家而務財用者,必自 小人矣。彼為善之,小人 之使為國家,災害并至。

When a person who presides over a state or a family makes wealth generation his chief business, he will employ wicked advisors to achieve his goals. He may consider such advisors to be good; but when such a person is employed in the administration of a state or family, calamities from Heaven will befall on the state or family.

此謂國不以利為利, 為利也。

雖有善者,亦無如之何矣! though a good advisor may replace and take the place, he may not be able to remedy the evil. This illustrates again the saying, "In a state, gain is not to be considered as prosperity, but prosperity is found in righteousness."

實能容之,以能保我子 孫黎民,尚亦有利哉!	Showing himself <b>able to bear them and employ them,</b> such a minister will be able to <b>protect my sons, grandsons, and citizens, and provide benefits to the kingdom!</b>	
人之有技, 媢嫉以惡之; 人之彥聖, 而違之俾不 通。	But if it is his character, when he finds men of ability, to be jealous and hate them; when he finds accomplished and perspicacious men, to oppose them and not allow their advancement.	
實不能容,以不能保我子孫黎民,亦曰殆哉!	Showing himself not able to bear them, such a minister will not be able to protect my sons, grandsons, and citizens, and shall be pronounced dangerous to the kingdom!



- Provide training and support to make sure they have skills and knowledge for success.
- Take time to observe and identify factors for sub-optimal performance.
- Provide timely and candid feedback. Establish clear ownership on next steps. Follow up.
- Take actions, as necessary, to protect team.
